Social Justice: Florida Legislation

The Florida State Legislature is now in session. Things are different this year due to the pandemic. Our Fellowship has actively participated in "Lobby Days" in past years and so our members have been able to advocate for and against proposed legislation in person during on-site meetings with our legislators.

This year, contact with our legislators will be by phone or email. But it should happen! Perhaps our voices need to be heard now more than ever. After the violence our country has experienced at the national level, we must respond to attempts to increase the use of firearms. Our Fellowship has always stood strong against gun violence and it is time to continue our work.



Senate Bill 498 / House Bill 259 would make dangerous changes to the state of Florida's gun laws, such as:

Teachers and staff with minimal training would be permitted to carry guns in schools, despite research that shows the presence of a gun increases the risks posed to children.

People with concealed weapon licenses would be allowed to carry guns on any property owned or controlled by a religious institution, including K-12 schools and colleges with no safeguards to prevent firearms from being carried around students.

Parishioners would be allowed to carry firearms at public schools while a religious institution uses the property to conduct services—even if classes or extracurricular activities are taking place.
